Course Content	 Warm-up exercises, posture, preparatory gesture and downbeat, eye contact and breathing. Conducting patterns, their size and dynamics. Releases. Articulations, dynamics, terminology (tempo, character). Entrances on all beats, asymmetrical meters, subdivision. Functions of the left hand: sustaining gestures, mirroring, dynamic levels. Cues, fermatas, instrumental transpositions, C-clefs. Changing time signatures, tempo changes.
