Course Content	PRIVATE LESSONS: One-hour, weekly private lessons. Lessons will concentrate on technical exercises, etude study, and solo repertory. Technical exercises and etude study are assigned by the instructor. Solo repertory is selected by the student with the instructor's approval. STUDIO CLASS: One-hour mandatory weekly studio classes in which students are expected to play at least twice throughout the semester.

	PUBLIC PERFORMANCE: one performance per semester at the student concerts that are organized by the Music Program. MEMORY: For instruments such as piano, guitar, voice etc. for which memorization is common practice, at least two pieces should be memorized for the jury examination. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: students may be required by the instructor to attend specific recitals, workshops, master-classes, or similar events with an emphasis on their primary instrument and are held on the European University Cyprus campus. Exceptions will be granted for students whose class schedules conflict with the event in question. In order to proceed to the Advanced Applied Primary the students should pass the Jury Examination with a minimum grade of C
